Explorer Dome: Space Show





British Science Week – 8th-17th March

The theme this year for British Science Week is 'Time!' It's the 30th anniversary of British Science Week – we are celebrating this huge milestone by thinking about time since the world began, and looking to the future!





Professor Bubbleworks – Friday 15th March

At the end of British Science Week, we will be visited by the team at Professor Bubbleworks. In order to explore the 'Time' theme for 2024, they have devised some fantastic science demonstrations such as exploring the perception of time, experimenting using a candle and balloons to demonstrate the different ways materials respond to heat. There will also be a demonstration using the popular Airzooka to show principles of air pressure and motion, providing insights into how air speed can be measured and perceived as well as hands-on rocketry activities that delve into the principles of force, motion, and speed measurement, connecting these to real-world physics applications.

International Day of Maths – Thursday 14th March

The 2024 challenge is to add mathematics to an everyday thing or place and share a photo of your creation. Everyone is invited to participate! Play with mathematics!

World Poetry Day – Thursday 21st March

National Poetry Day is an annual event which takes place across the whole of the UK in celebration of poetry. The day is intended to help people discover and enjoy poetry and encourage everyone to read, write, and share poems. World Poetry Day demonstrates the importance of poetry and the value that poetry adds to society.

Nursery and Reception children will be performing Nursery Rhymes they have learnt by heart, and Key Stage One children will be performing poems they have learnt by heart.





World Water Day – Friday 22nd March

The theme of World Water Day 2024 is 'Water for Peace'.

When we cooperate on water, we create a positive ripple effect – fostering harmony, generating prosperity and building resilience to shared challenges.
